**DofE:** those 4<sup>th</sup> and above who are enrolled on this scheme should maximise the use of activities that will help them qualify for this award. ie

Volunteering Estate work, CCF NCO, work in a charity shop  
 Skill: Almost any of the other activities will involve you learning or practising a skill.  
 Physical Recreation: Any team game that is played on a Saturday, judo, soccer, hockey, tennis, swimming, horse riding mixed netball, girls rugby or soccer, badminton, (Games on a Monday or Wednesday do not count because you have to do them)

You may need to do an activity for more than one term to qualify.  
 There should be a regular commitment averaging at least an hour a week.

**Bronze Award (14+ Years)**

Volunteering	Skills	Physical Recreation
3 Months	3 Months	3 Months

All participants must undertake a further 3 months in either the Service, Skills or Physical Recreation Section.

**Silver Award (15+ Years)**

Volunteering	Skills	Physical Recreation
6 Months	One Section for 6 months and the other Section for 3 months	

Participants who do not hold their Bronze Award must undertake a further 6 months in either the Service or the longer of the Skills / Physical Recreation Section.

**Gold Award (16+ Years)**

Volunteering	Skills	Physical Recreation
12 Months	One Section for 12months and the other Section for 6 months	

Participants who do not hold their Silver Award must undertake a further 6 months in either the Service or the longer of the Skills / Physical Recreation Section.

There is also the requirement to do an expedition (walking, horseback, kayaking etc) and, for Gold, a residential course – details from Mr Watson.
